Ready to checkout a book from the Library?

- To have full access to available library features, you must have an account.
- You do not need an account if you only want to search for library content.

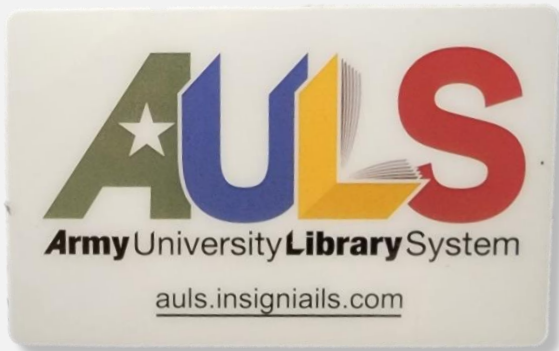

- If no AULS account, register to create one (registration not needed if only searching content on the website)



1. Click the "Register" icon, then fill out the seven mandatory fields identified by an asterisk (*). *NOTE: Do not use your full name as your Username.*

2. Once registered, your account will expire in seven days. You must go to the library to verify your account within seven days; otherwise, the account will be inactivated.

3. You will receive an email with your AULS account information. You need to bring to the library your assigned barcode number so you can checkout books and other material.

Steps for searching and checking out books and other material

- Search for the book or item of interest using one of the ten options available. Some options will produce a broader list of search results

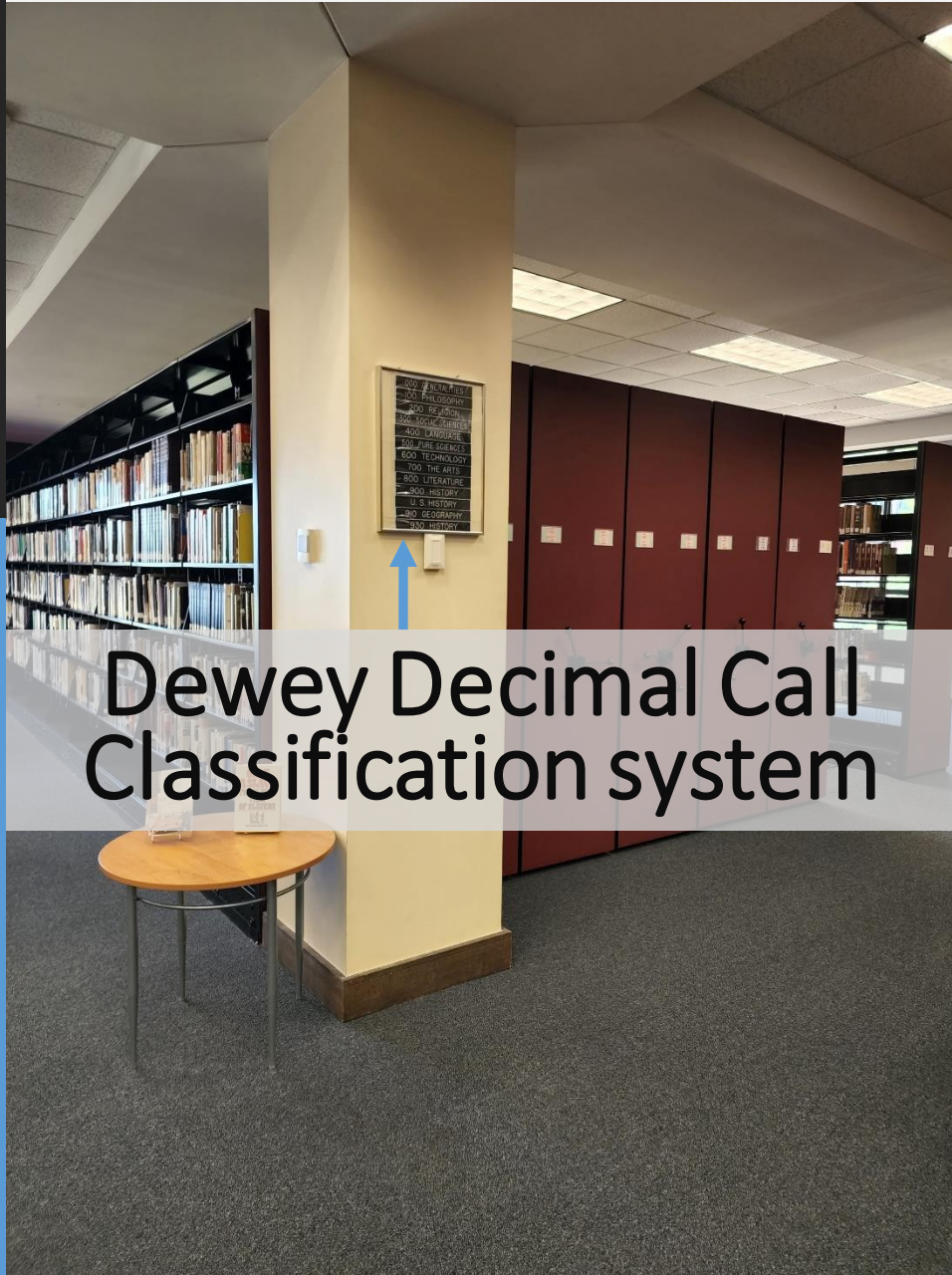


Library Organization

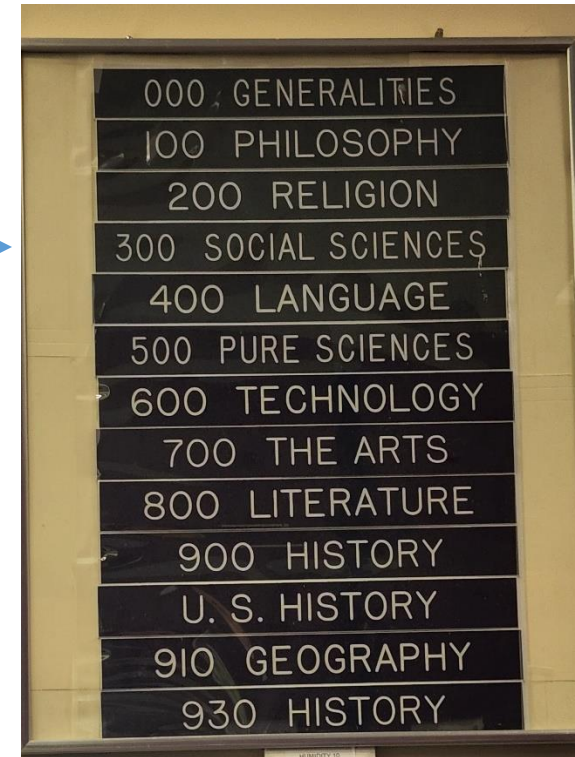
The SSI Library uses the Dewey Decimal Call Classification System. This system groups together books on similar subjects by mean of the call numbers. There are ten main Dewey Decimal call number classification or classes.

- **000** – Computer Science, Information, & General Works
- **100** – Philosophy and Psychology
- **200** – Religion
- **300** – Social Sciences
- **400** – Language
- **500** – Science
- **600** – Technology
- **700** – Arts & Recreation
- **800** – Literature
- **900** – History & Geography

- If you are not familiar with the Dewey Decimal Call Classification, you will find the chart in the middle of the library.
- Ask library staff if you are not sure under which Dewey Decimal Call Classification the item you are looking for falls under.

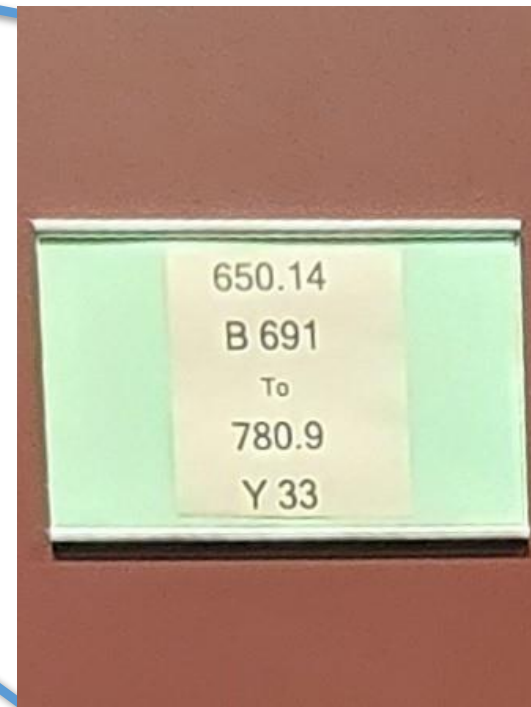
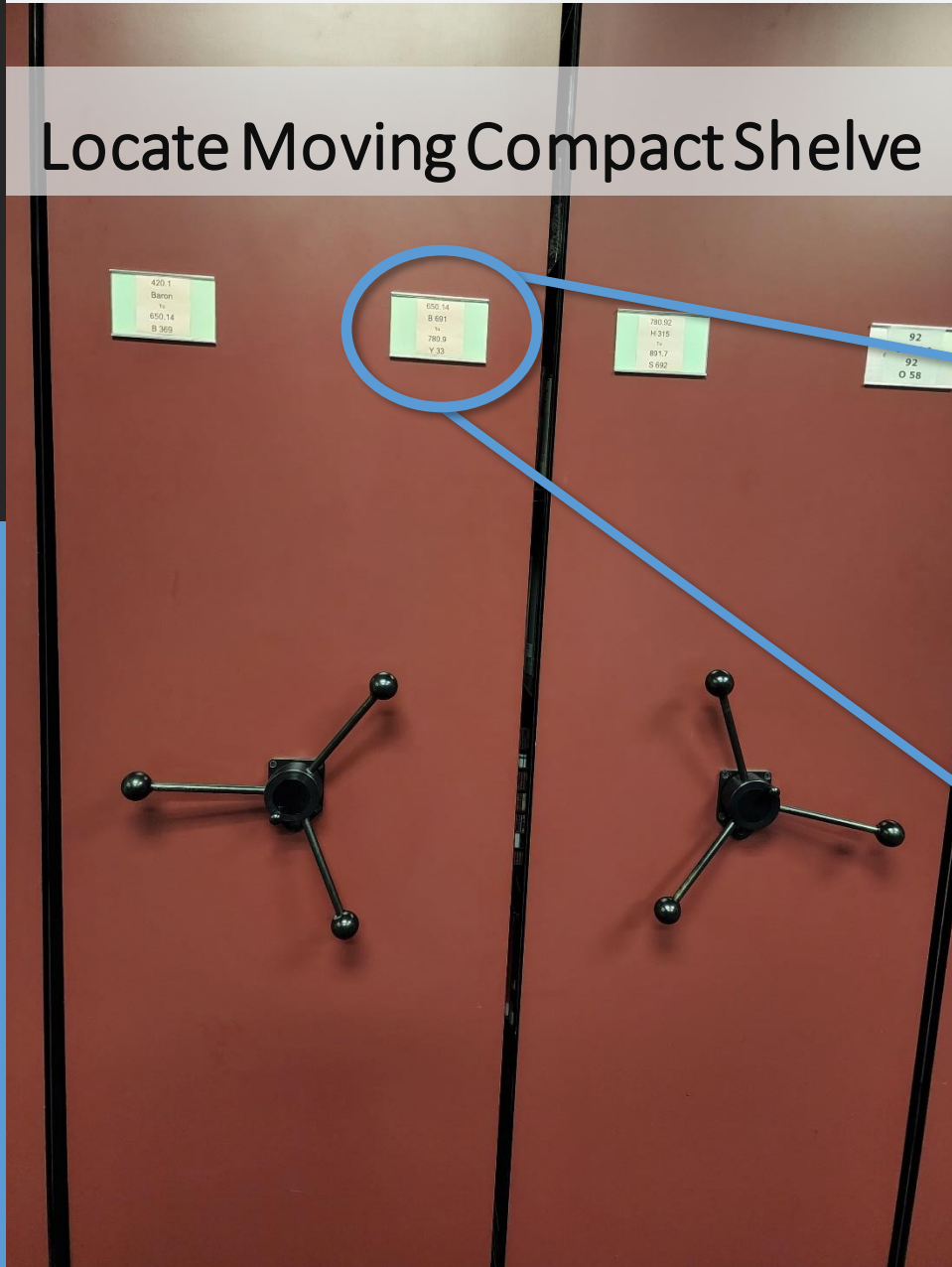


Dewey Decimal Call Classification system



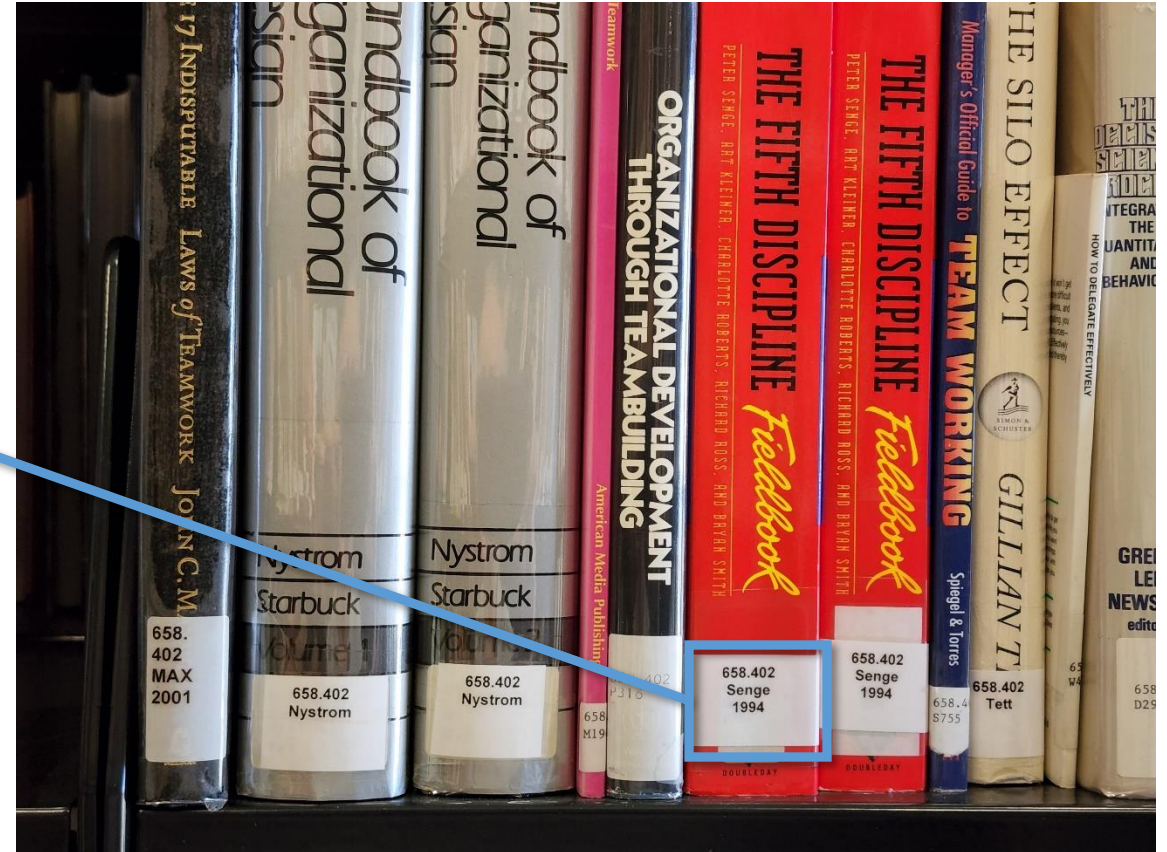
Locate Moving Compact Shelve

- Locate the Moving Compact Shelve with the Dewy Decimal Call Classification range.
- Verify no one is between shelves, and once the coast is clear, rotate the Rotating Spin Handle in proper direction to access book.



Locate Book

- Find the book by verifying the Dewey Decimal Call number (in this example 658.402).
- Ask library staff for assistance if you cannot find the item you are looking for.



Self-Checkout Kiosk

- Bring to the self-checkout kiosk the item(s) you want to checkout.
- Scan or enter your AULS barcode and press the **Enter** key, then enter your AULS account password.
- Scan library label for the item you are checking out (see next slide).

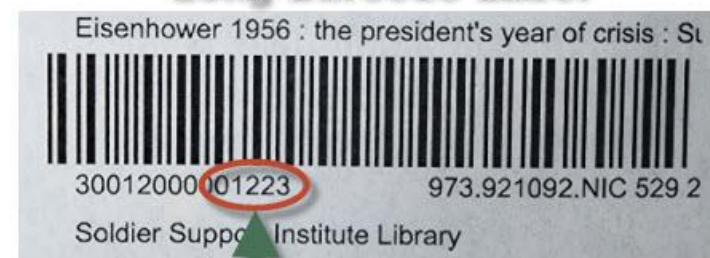

Returning Books



- You can return books by dropping them into the Book Depository chute or by coming inside the library and returning them to the Librarian.
- The Librarian processes all returned items daily.





Printing, Copying and Scanning

- If you would like to print, copy, or scan library material, you must first read, then sign the Copyright and Privacy Restrictions sheet located on a document tray, next to the copier.
- Copyright and Privacy Restrictions also apply when you use personal devices to take pictures of library materials.
- Place signed sheet on the bottom document tray.

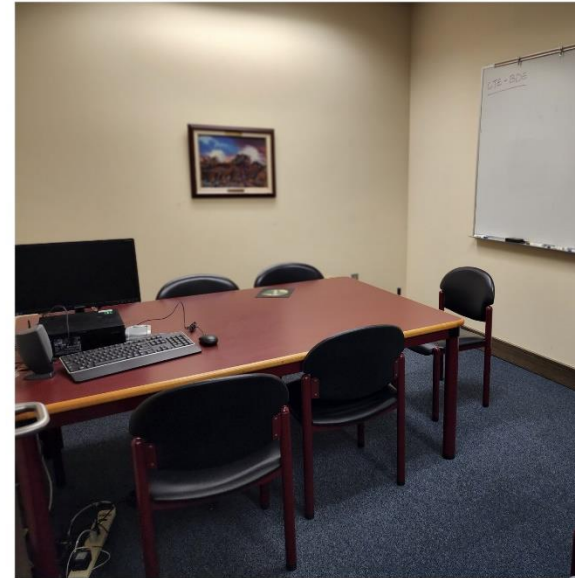




Studying/reading areas and Meeting Rooms



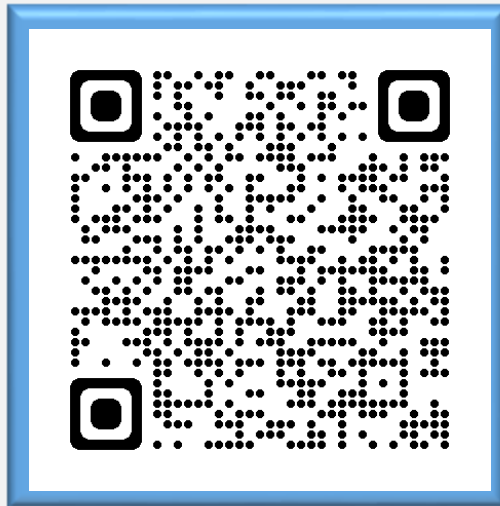

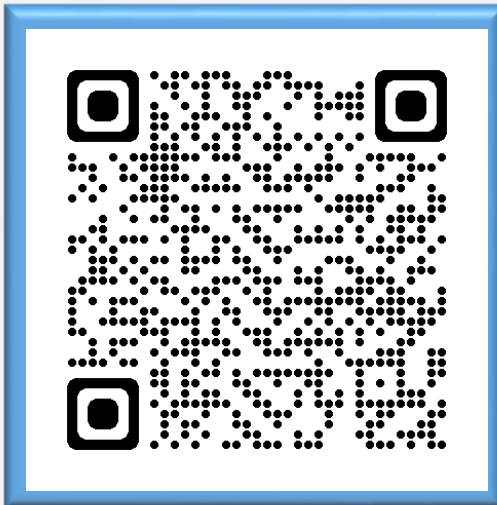
World War II Operational Documents
